REPORT

Overview

In line with our goals and objectives as a non-profit organization committed to developing leadership capacity among Nigerian youth, partnering with Lagos State Education District IV has provided us the opportunity to expand and continue to fulfil our mission.

To effectively organize the five days leadership workshop and be able to deliver quality training to the selected students required additional facilitators with diverse backgrounds and experiences in order to ensure impactful sessions on the various topics covered.

Participants were 87 students from Ten Secondary Schools under District IV, Sabo Yaba, Lagos. This year's event was also more inclusive because we worked with the Education District to have students with special needs added to the participants.

From the beginning of the workshop to the end, we learned together, laughed together, dreamed together and collaborated on ways we might make a difference in each other's lives, the lives of others in our communities, Nigeria, African continent and the world at large.

We left with a renewed sense of hope, inspiration & empowerment, along with many new friends.

The workshop started with an interaction with the students to find out their expectations from the workshop, pre evaluation forms was shared for students to fill in for us to ascertain how the workshop will be impactful to the students and if their needs are met. Majority of the students indicated that they want to learn something new other than their usual studies.

A detailed account of the daily activities during the workshop follows:

Day 1 – August 6, 2018

• **Omadudu Oghenefejiro Josephine** our Volunteer facilitator started with practical vocational skills. The participants were taught how to make liquid soap and perfume. They were also taught the basics of starting a small business within their community. At the end of the skills training students went home with the liquid soap and perfume that was made.

Day 2 – August 7, 2018

• **Mr Felix Iziomoh**, Executive Director of ICLDNG on the second day of the workshop trained the students on Goal setting and mapping; it was fun as the participants learnt about Goal Mapping for Academic Success. He taught the students how to map their goals with the Goal mapping worksheets by Brian Mayne. Students were excited as they came out to share their goals with other students. It was a shock, where a special need student mapped his goal using sign language.

Day 3 – August 8, 2018

- The students were taken through series of career path and how to choose a career. We had various speakers from different profession which includes; Lawyer Barrister Phillips Obuesi, Civil Engineer Engineer Temitope Emiabata, Human Resource Personnel Mr. Seyi Babatunde, Mass Communicator Magdalene Adanyi, Accountant Richard Abelagi, Psychologist Taiwo Fashola and a Crime prevention expert Mr. Chris Ibe who dwelt on core values, effects of drug abuse and wrong association and choices.
- At the end, the students pledged to be the 'NEXT GENERATION' that will make positive things happen in Nigeria.
- It was also nice to have one of our last year leadership workshop beneficiaries Saka Shukurat who was the Head Prefect (Girl) from Eric Moore Senior Secondary School, she came around to inspire the students and how she benefitted from the workshop.

Day 4 – August 9, 2018

- **Mr. Olakunle Ajayi** took our students through the Leadership session. He explored the qualities and attributes of a good leader. The day was fun as students discuss who they consider to be a good leader and why.
- The students were intrigued with Mr. Ibe Chris as they requested having him back; he talked about Time management and honesty and also engaged the students in activities that portrays honesty.

Day 5 – August 10, 2018

• It was a beautiful ending to a great event. The session was on Internet Safety, Adedoyin Adedeji started with videos on Internet Safety and he spoke about understanding ICT and areas students can easily build tech businesses. Mrs Lamide Thompson Odeneye taught the pupils on Internet Safety, Things they need to know about Internet Safety, what Cyber safety is and how students can protect themselves online.

Thanks to all our amazing facilitators who took time out of their busy schedule to come inspire the students, also, a big thank you to Education District IV, Lagos State, and finally to the ICLDNG Team.

Recommendations

1. To reduce the growing rate of cyber-criminal activities among our youths, we have to help these young ones understand how to leverage the internet and technology for economic empowerment. We have to help them build the right skillset through Technology.

2. The education sector needs to do more to incorporate internet usage and safety into the Nigerian educational curriculum right from Secondary school. Young Nigerians need to understand the importance of properly using the Internet.
