I have had the privilege of working with Barbara for nearly 15 years and count her not only as a valued colleague but also as a dear friend. Barbara joined the URI staff a few months before our first Stanford global summit in 1997 and immediately brought great skill and a high ethic of service into the foundational work of helping an organization run effectively. Without this foundation, the great visioning that brought URI into being would never have happened.

Over the years, Barbara has provided support in operations and financial management, communications, human resources and overall support wherever and whenever it was wanted and needed.

In 2000, I asked Barbara if she would begin exploring a unique URI approach to peacebuilding, which might help answer the question I had been asked on a trip to Manipur, India – “What will URI do to help us ‘end religiously motivated violence?’”

As she always responded when asked to do something, Barbara said, “Yes”; and dove in. Though she often wondered if she could grow enough to meet this opportunity and challenge, over the years she led URI on a magnificent journey – education for herself and others at Eastern Mennonite University’s Summer Peacebuilding Institute; fruitful relationships with key people in the field of interfaith peacebuilding, like Mohammed Abu-Nimer, Cynthia Sampson and Libby Hoffman; a peacebuilding training before and during the 2002 Global Assembly in Rio de Janeiro, which led to the creation of the Interfaith Peacebuilding Guide; and, finally, the connection of URI with John Paul Lederach’s *The Moral Imagination – the Art and Soul of Peacebuilding*, which formed the basis for a two-year pilot project and led to the vision for the Traveling Peace Academy.

This is a moment of great sadness, of grief, for me, as I imagine it will be for many in our community.

Let this also a moment to celebrate Barbara as the remarkable human being she is and to celebrate all that she has contributed to the heart and soul of URI for nearly 15 years.

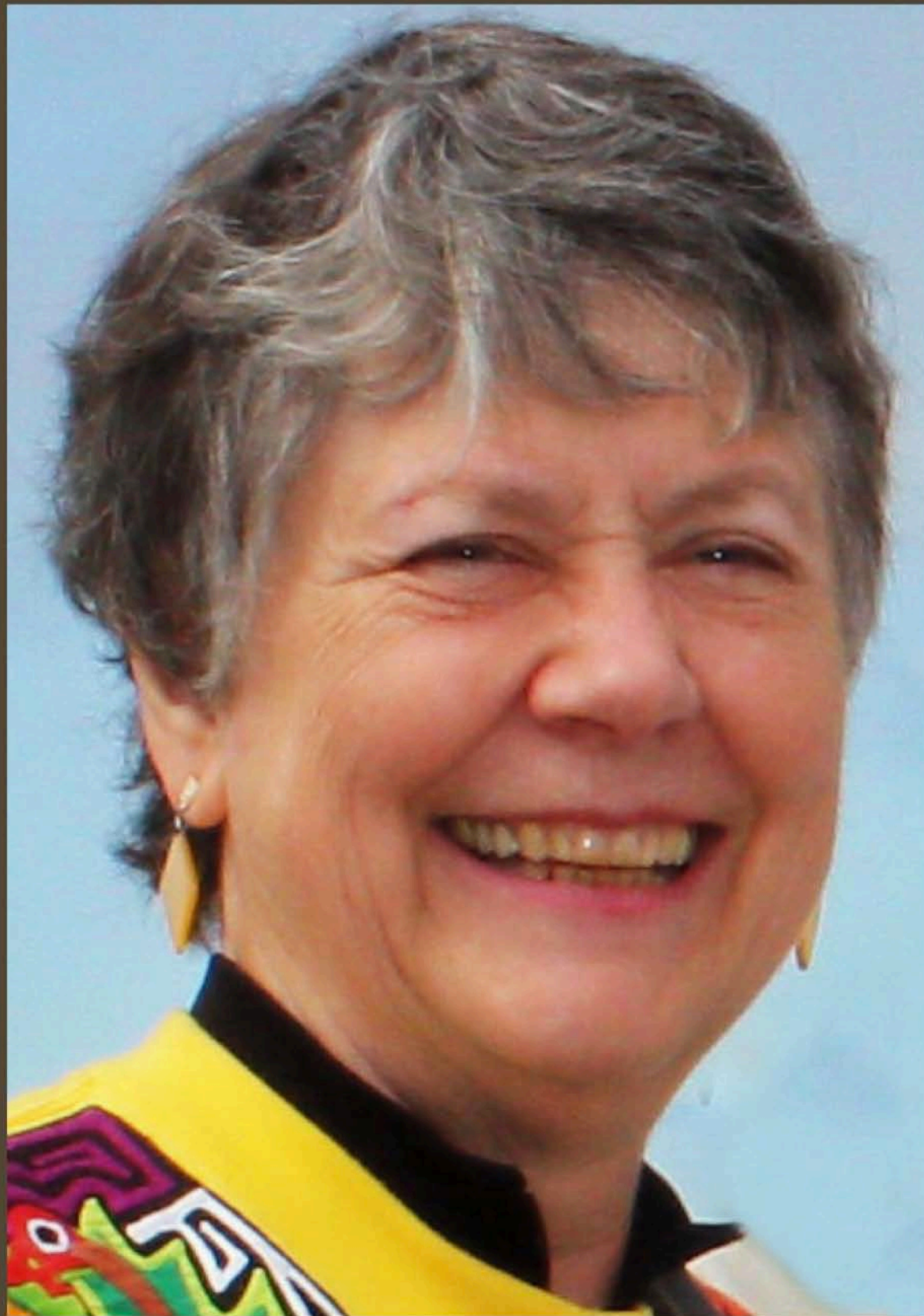
I extend my deep thanks to our sister Barbara for everything she is making and still doing to the whole world and will be glad that at least she will still be part of our beautiful family in URI.

As you are so often behind the camera, it is not easy to find a picture of you. I found this lovely one on the web, which I really like.

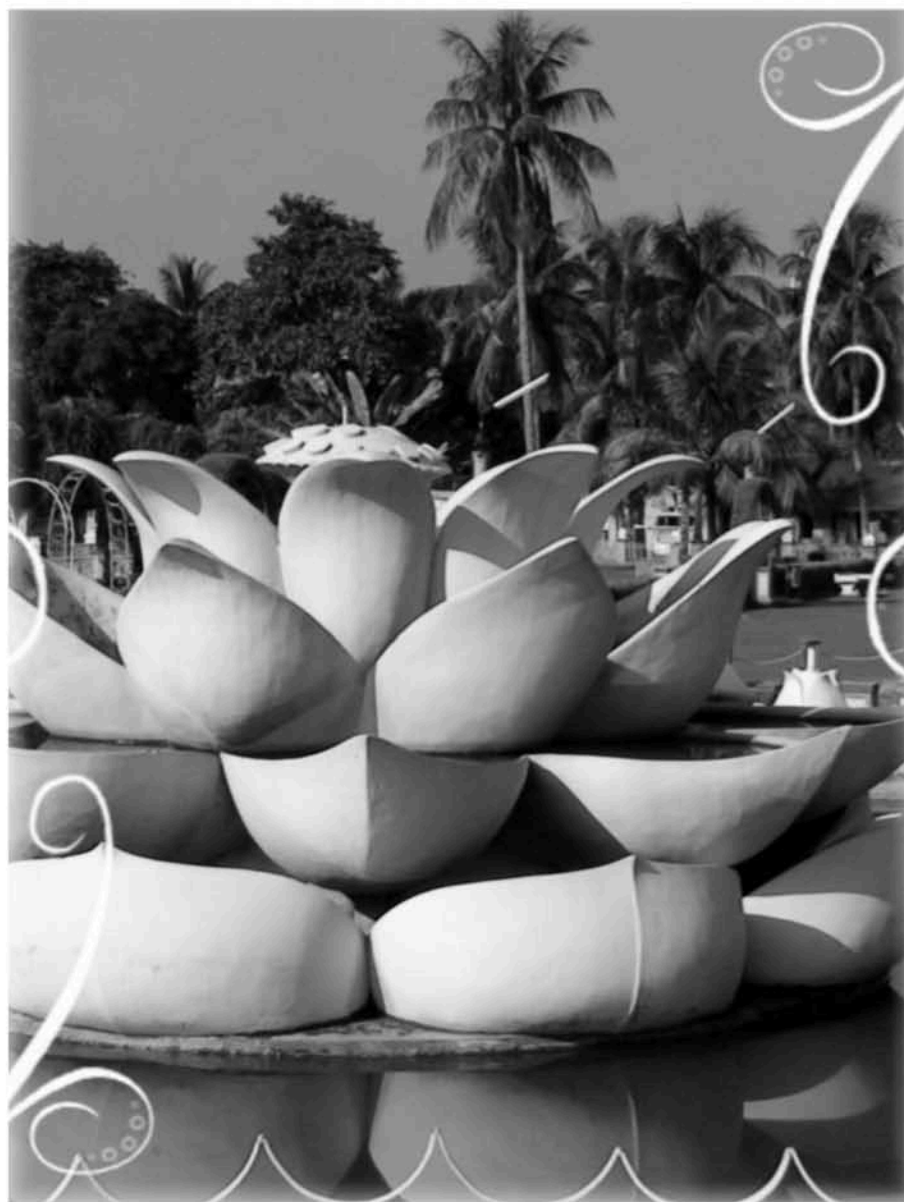
You are a wonderful friend and human being. Many memories bind us together.

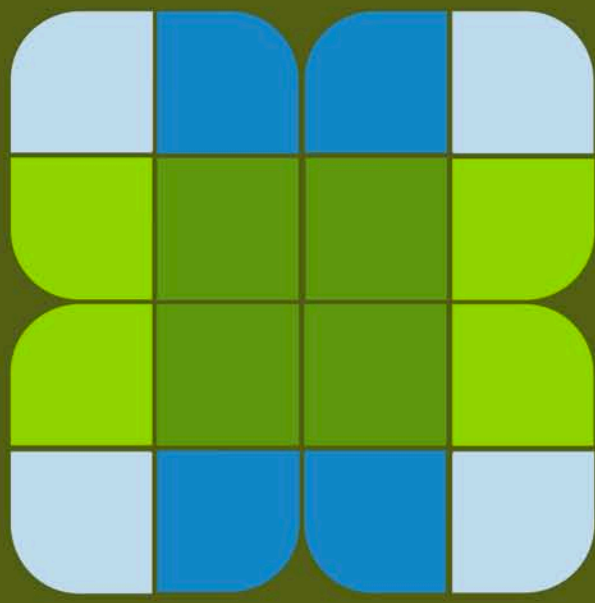
I always thought Barbara took this photo – but now I see her head peeking out among the group. In any case, it will always make me think of her with love and gratitude.

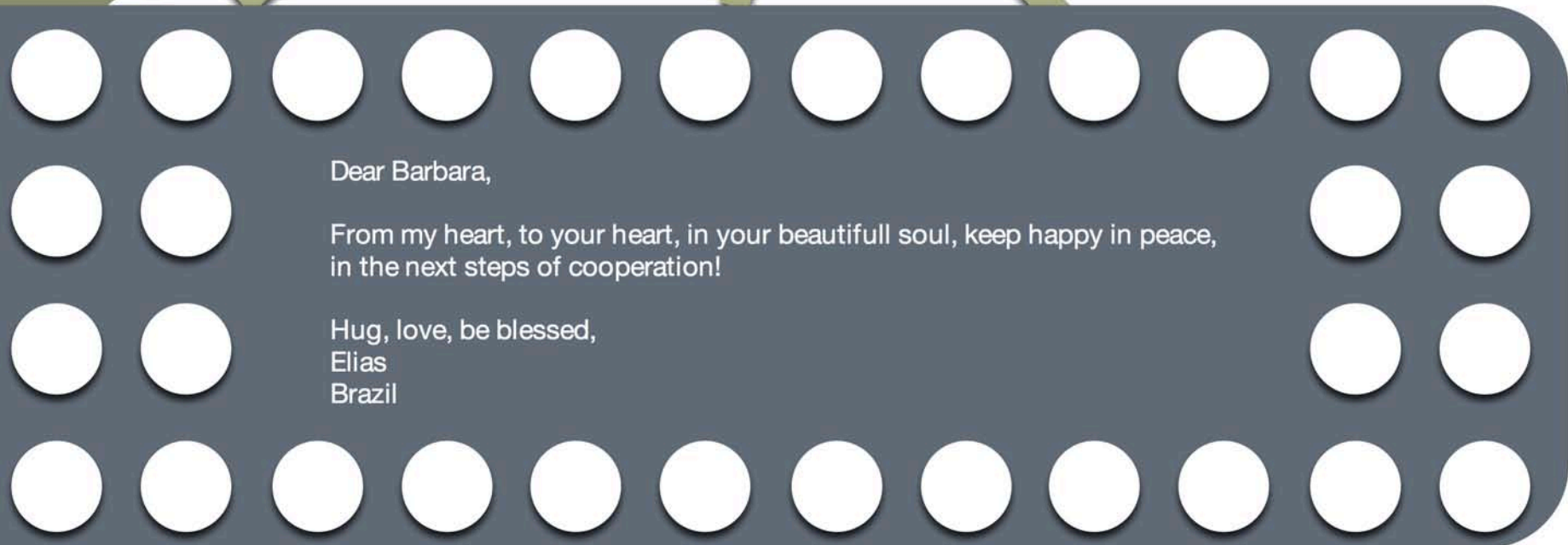
Dear Barbara,

Our work together has been like the castoff Christmas tree that took root sideways in our fields in Michigan – watching things take new root and grow in all sorts of unexpected ways.


