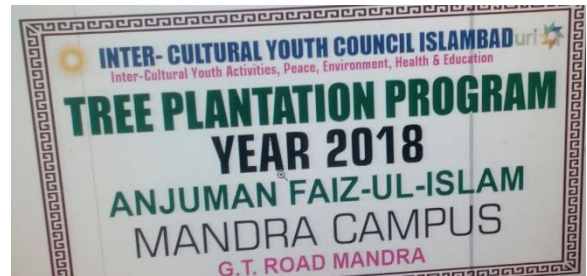
SECOND WEEK OF FREE MEDICAL CAMP ARRANGED ON 25-02-2018
