Inspired by the search for establishing interfaith harmony in line with the principle of United Religions Initiative, Cosmic Community Centre commenced the conference in the inter-textuality series in the year 2005; in collaboration with Dr. Alexander Mar Thoma Centre for Dialoque, Kottarakara. Since then till 2019. eight such inter-faith conferences have been held in different countries within Asia. In these conferences several scholars from different parts of the world met together and presented their papers. Normally these papers are received prior to the conference for consolidation and to get it printed in a book form. The book containing the papers used to be released during the conference and made available to the participants. These books are kept in libraries and widely students and researchers for used by references.





MORAL IMAGINATION PEACE BUILDING PROGRAMME

It was in 2006 that the URI initiated the unique pilot project called "The Moral Imagination Training Program". The goal was to train a good number of master trainers in peace building. Acclaimed peace practitioners Prof. Dr. John Paul Lederach and Prof. Dr. Herm Weaver were extended their services. Libby Hoffman of Catalysts for Peace offered funding. Teams consisting of three members from countries like the Philippines, India, Ethiopia and Uganda were appointed in addition to an Organisational Learning Team (OLT) consisting of Rev. Dr. Charles Gibbs, Sally Mahe, Barabara Hartford, Marites Africa and Dr.

It was a two year long process of leaning based on action and reflection. Trainings were conducted in United States (twice), India, the Philippines, Ethiopia and Uganda with a gap of three months. Filed trips of two members were also arranged to different countries to study conflict situations in detail, which were reported to the larger group. On the whole, it was an excellent training series which led to the formation of the Travelling Peace Academy (TPA), which later trained around 400 peace builders in different countries.


